Early Childhood Education Center

With positive COVID cases on the rise, our early childhood education center is doing everything possible in keeping our children safe and healthy. All of our staff are fully vaccinated and have been trained in proper sanitizing, disinfecting, and COVID-19 safety guidelines through the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment and the Colorado Department of Human Services.

Our Early Childhood Education Center requires that everyone on our campus wear a mask, covering both the mouth and nose. This also includes our ECE students 2 years of age and older. If you do not have a mask, upon entering our facility, there are disposable masks available for both adults and children. We ask all parents and families to help us model and encourage the children with proper mask wearing. Please note that children do not have to wear their masks during outdoor play time, meal time, or nap time.

If a classroom should have an exposure to Covid-19 or other illnesses, moms will be contacted by either the ECE Director or the school nurse. Next step directions will be given based on the exposure and guidance from the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment.

If your child is having symptoms such as cough, runny nose, fever, vomiting, diarrhea, or any other signs of illness, please keep them home until they are symptom free for 24 hours without medication or have been seen by a physician. A physician clearance letter may be required to re-enter the classroom.

Who Can Access the ECE Center?

The ECE Center is accessible for child drop off and pick up. When dropping off or picking up, masks are required covering both the mouth and nose area for ages two and up. We are currently restricting anyone from entering the ECE classrooms other than the enrolled children and ECE staff. This also applies to Florence Crittenton Service staff, High School staff, outside coaches, volunteers, and any other outside visitors.

Pick up and drop off will take place at the classroom door. We ask that children get picked up and dropped off in a timely manner to avoid hallway traffic and gathering. If you are not comfortable with inside drop off or pick up, the outside option is still available. However, checking in/out on the attendance/CCAP laptops must be done for both forms of picking up and dropping off.

Breast feeding moms are able to breastfeed in the breastfeeding corner located outside of the first infant classroom.
